2015 NEWMA INTERIM MEETING

NEWMA will hold its Interim Meeting on October, 2015. Location TBD.

NCWM Hot Button Issues!

The Specifications and Tolerances Committee has 20 voting items to consider during the May 2015 NEWMA Annual Conference to bring forth to the 100th Annual NCWM conference held in Philadelphia, PA in July 2015. Items of most discussion:

- 1. Item 232-4, 237-1(from L & R agenda) and 337-1 will be considered as a package. These items were returned to the respective committees after the vote was denied at the 2014 NCWM Annual Conference. Since then the Natural Gas Steering Committee working with L & R and S & T produced the revised agenda item contained in Publication 16. Consideration of the items contain proposed revisions to NIST Handbook 44 to recognize indication of CNG and LNG sales in terms of the volume equivalent units or mass units, method of sale, definitions and language clarified.
- 2. Taximeter items 354-1, 354-2, 354-3, 354-4, and 354-5 will be considered as a group which includes proposed revisions, updates to language and changes in technology relating to recording elements and operational features concerning the Taximeter code in NIST Handbook 44.
- 3. S & T committee will consider agenda item 360-5 Electric Vehicle Fueling and Submetering; the adaptation of a draft code for inclusion in NIST Handbook 44 to ensure accuracy and transparency for drivers of electric vehicles and power resellers.

The Law and Regulations Committee has eight voting items to consider during the May NEWMA Annual Conference. These will be voting items at the NCWM Annual Conference. Agenda items which have generated a lot of discussion during previous NEWMA and NCWM meetings and Open Hearings are listed below:

- A. Items 232-4, 237-1, and 337-1 from S&T will be considered as a package. They involve the sale of compressed natural gas and liquefied natural gas. These items were debated at the 2014 NCWM Annual Conference and returned to committees. Since then the Natural Gas Steering Committee working with L&R and S&T has produced the agenda items contained in Publication 16. Method of sale is listed in 232-4 as both volumetric and mass. Definitions are clarified in 237-1. Language in Handbook 44 is also clarified in S&T item 337-1.
- B. Agenda item 237-3 concerning diesel filters in motor vehicles was also returned to committee at the 2014 NCWM Annual Conference. This item requires that dispensers shall have a 10 micron or smaller nominal pore-sized filter except for dispensers with flow rates greater than 15 gallons per minute which shall have a 30 micron or smaller nominal pore size filter. Even though NEWMA recommended that this item be withdrawn during its October 2014 Interim Meeting the NCWM L&R

Committee has moved it forward as a voting item. This item has been on the NCWM agenda since the 2012 Annual Conference.

These items along with the others in Publication 16 will be debated during the NEWMA 2015 Annual Conference Open Hearings.

Professional Development Committee. The success of professional development within weights and measures is dependent on each individual and jurisdiction. The work of the PDC is designed to raise the bar for regulators and service companies and provide tools for successful training, evaluation of knowledge and understanding, and safety on the job.
